Describe a moment in your recent ministry that you recognize as one of success and fulfillment.

When I started ministry at St. Andrew, there was a real concern that a split in the church could happen over certain theological issues because another PC(USA) congregation in town had suffered from a split. St. Andrew wanted to make sure their pastor was fully involved in the life of the community and the Presbytery. In collaboration with the other PC (USA) pastors in town, we covenanted to truly be the connectional church. From this collaboration we endeavored to do more joint worship and communal events. Many of these joint offerings evolved from local PC(USA) gatherings to an ecumenical gathering. One such event started an open theological conversation on various religious and secular topics. The clergy from this ecumenical gathering approached the owners of a local brewery and asked about hosting our theological discussions at the brewery. The owners were thrilled with the idea and joined the clergy group to form "Theology on Tap (TOT)." The purpose of TOT was to demonstrate how to have difficult conversations in a civil, gracious, and loving way. We tackled divisive topics such as immigration, racism, mental health, and gun control. The response from the community was tremendous! Many Tuesday nights have been standing room with some people from inside the church, but mostly from previously or unchurched people. The refrain has been, "I didn't think the church would ever talk about this in this way. Especially not in East Texas."

Describe the ministry setting to which you believe God is calling you.

The ministry setting that I believe God is calling me is one that seeks justice, loves kindness, and humbly walks with God. God calls us to be a light to our community that proclaims the Gospel at all times using words if necessary. The ministry setting God is calling me to is one that is active in the local and foreign community, provides for the poor and needy, uplifts the brokenhearted, and makes room at the table for all of God's children. I believe God is calling me to a place that practices true hospitality and values every generation as one that has a voice, a role, and a talent to share. This is done through an understanding of grace, love, and respect for one another. I believe God is calling me to a ministry that is joyful in worship and allows for creativity from all people in that worship to shine through our praises to God. Because I believe that God delights when we are creators of justice and joy, compassion and peace.

What areas of growth have you identified in yourself?

Learning to listen. I have always fancied myself as a good communicator and as someone who can communicate in multiple ways in order to get a message across or to get people on the same page. However, as I have matured emotionally and spiritually, I have come to realize that healthy communication heavily involves being an active listener. Hearing and listening are very different. Where I see growth in myself is in being an active listener. You cannot communicate if you are not willing to listen. If I am going to be able to communicate with someone or a group of people, I must first learn to listen before I can fully understand the best way to communicate. What I have found when it comes to listening is that it is not unlike many acquired skills. To be a good listener, it takes a willingness to learn, time, and a lot of practice. I believe to be the best possible disciple of Christ and pastor; I need to practice and grow in how I listen.

Describe a time when you have led change.

The church I serve was once thriving with young families and the youth program reflected a younger church. Now, the church is older, and the youth are few and far between. After a year of ministry at the church, trial and error, and communication with many people on what the issues were, I was able to get a feel for what kind of youth ministry options were possible. The three small PC(USA) congregations in town were in a similar situation when it came to the youth ministry programs. I, following many conversations with church leaders, engaged the leaders at the other congregations about the possibility of combining our youth to create a program. Through prayer and discernment, we decided to give this idea a chance. Like with any change, there was confusion, reluctance, and questions. One of the congregations had a large building with great youth hall, but not as many youths. They opened their space to the group. This church also had leaders that wanted to begin a youth handbell choir. What started small has now began to blossom. From this combination, the churches have forged a new relationship together while still maintaining their own unique qualities. Over the three years of building this program, we have seen growth in many tangible ways. We do mission work together, go to conferences together, and have genuinely learned to love each other. That is the connectional church and it was overflowed to all of the congregations.
